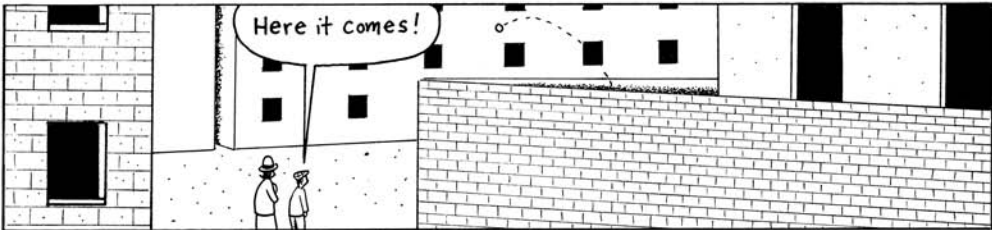


# BLOOD
